# **Sermon Starters**

#### WHAT SIN CAN DO James 1:12-15

#### INTRODUCTION:

- 1. Today man has many enemies.
  - A. Of these enemies, sin is number one.
  - B. Because of sin man has:
    - 1. Physical infirmities, of which many are due directly to sin.
    - 2. Man is separated from God unless something is done James 1:15.
- 2. There is a tendency to place a false label on sin.
  - A. When was the last time anyone has heard of an old-fashioned sinner?
    - 1. The problem is one is sick, or it is societies fault.
      - A. People call drunkenness an illness, while God calls it a sin 1 Corinthians 6:10.
  - B. Satan is doing a fantastic job of picturing sin as some thing good.
    - 1. We are being told to "grab all the gusto" that we can.
    - 2. But we're not being told of the heartaches, starving children, and deaths that go along with this so called "gusto."
  - Sin is even being dismissed by some who claim to be Christians.
    - 1. "Everybody is doing it."
  - D. We need to realize is, changing the label on poison to say "Orange Juice" doesn't change the contents.
    - 1. And changing the label on sin won't change the results Romans 6:23.
      - A. Adultery affair.
      - B. Homosexuality gay.
- 3. The New Testament gives us the true picture of sin as God sees it.

#### **BODY:**

#### 1. SIN ENSLAVES

- A. Romans 6:16
  - 1. Servant stronger slave, therefore one became a slave to sin.
- B. John 8:34
  - This is not speaking of the one who sins in a moment of weakness, but one who continues to sin.

#### 2. SIN SPOTS

- A. James 1:27
  - 1. In God's eyes, one who is in sin is spotted, or unclean.
- B. The story of the Prodigal son serves as an example of contamination by sin Luke 15:11-32.
  - 1. "Give me my portion" (v. 12) "far country" (v. 13) "wasted" all on riotous living (v. 13).
  - 2. His fair-weather friends forsook him, and he ended up in a pig pen, which to the Jew, there was nothing more loathsome.
- C. Peter uses this exact figure to show how dirty sin is 2 Peter 2:22.

#### 3. SIN SCARS

A. Galatians 6:7, 8

  - 1. Probably every time Peter heard a rooster crow he remembered what he had done.
    - Even though he was forgiven, his memory was not erased.
- C. Psalms 51:3
  - As David looked back on his life and reflected on his sin with Bathsheba and Uriah, he always was aware of it.
- D. 1 Timothy 1:15
  - 1. Paul, many years after his conversion, remembered his sin.
- E. Story of father who drove a nail in a post for each error of his son and withdrew one when he was good. Boy saddened by scars left.
  - 1. God's law of sowing and reaping cannot be mocked.

#### 4. SIN SEPARATES

- A. Isaiah 59:1, 2
  - 1. During this point in time in which Isaiah wrote, the Jews were calling upon God in prayer, but getting no apparent answer.
  - 2. They thought there was something wrong with God's ability to answer.
    - A. Maybe his arm was shortened.
  - 3. Others thought there was something wrong with His hearing.
  - 4. However, Isaiah explains the problem.
    - A. It's not with God.
      - 1. He can hear.
      - 2. He can answer.
    - B. The problem was sin.
      - 1. It severs fellowship with God.
      - 2. Prayers seem to fall upon deaf ears, and worship is rejected.
      - 3. Families and friends are separated.
      - 4. There is eternal separation from good.
