Dean of Students

With the departure of **Brother Armstrong**, we will begin a search for a new Dean, along with continuing our search for a new director. After several discussions with some of our experienced teachers, we would like to find a retired, or close to retirement graduate of the school, or a school of preaching, who may already have some retirement income, who can serve as Dean, recruit, travel for the school and teach some classes. One of our adjuncts, Brother Ken Hope, said, "that will not be easy." He is right, but we feel, for our needs, this is an ideal person and I firmly believe this will all work out.

School Update

Besides looking for a new Director and Dean, things at the school are going great. We just finished our second quarter and all our students finished strong. The new teachers, **Jeremy Sprouse** and **Philip McIntosh**, who stepped in and taught classes last quarter were just amazing. And **Jeremy's** class, **Fundamentals 1**, on **How We Got The Bible**, is recorded and in the slow editing process. We hope to have it online soon!

Becky (my wife), our children, and I, are all up in Indiana area for the break between second and third quarters. My wife is from Indiana, and we can stay with her family and use their farm as our hub while reaching out to congregations and potential students in Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois. Our families are both from up north, and dad was converted and preached in Ohio and Indiana for many years. Plus, my first works were in Ohio and Indiana. So, we have many contacts up here, and it is just not feasible to visit to show presentations and recruit the area unless we are on break. We have already visited three congregations and showed the presentation at two, in Corydon, Indiana and Hanoverton, Ohio. Now, for you history buffs!!! Hanoverton is on the famed Lincoln Trail, the path he took once elected to the Capital. Hanoverton is a small village of 300-400 people, but it is famed for the Spread Eagle Inn, which has been operating since 1837. It is famed because this is where President Lincoln stayed during his initial trip to the capital. Since then, many politicians, who have just won office have stopped and stayed there on their way to Washington.

Also, we showed the presentation in Corydon, Indiana last night, and this is where the **John Wright Restoration Movement** was back in the early 1800's. He and his family actually started a congregation in Corydon. History records that by the time **John Wright** and his family passed on, that there wasn't a Baptist denomination left in southern Indiana, they had converted them all. On the 3rd of July, we will be showing the presentation at the church in **Palmyra**, Indiana. Originally, this was a Baptist group back in the early 1800's, and **John Wright** moved there and worked with them for two months, and they were all then baptized into Christ. They then took the name Baptist off their building and added the name Church of Christ. They have been worshipping there in Spirit and Truth for almost 200 years now, and it will be an honor to show the presentation there in a few days.

Highlighting A Graduate Brother Rick Popejoy

I am very proud to introduce our graduates to you each month. I am particularly grateful for Brother Popejoy. He has been there for advice, and to answer questions for me, and to help point me in the right direction on several occasions this year. He is a great man of God! And evidence that this school is a great training institution!

Brother Popejoy has been married to **Mrs. Mona** for 36 years. Together they have four children and seven grandchildren. **Rick** graduated from the **Brown Trail School of Preaching** in 1984 and has been preaching for over 34 years in Texas, Oklahoma, and Wyoming.

He presently serves the **9th & Main Church of Christ** in San Angelo, Texas as a shepherd and a preacher. Rick is also an instructor for the **Online Academy of Biblical Studies**. He teaches classes on **First Principles, The New Testament Church, and Jeremiah**.



He directs campaigns where he leads a team of workers from several states in evangelistic door-knocking campaigns every year. He conducts gospel meetings and seminars on the family, leadership, teaching, and evangelism. Rick is also a co-director of the **Young Men Development Conference** held at the **BCS Church of Christ in College Station, Texas** each year. He is the co-host of a daily radio program entitled, **Reflections Upon The Precious Book Divine** that can be heard on **The Gospel Radio Network** (M-F, 11:30 AM - 12:30 PM).

Rick has also published two periodicals during his 34 years of preaching: **Apostolic Echoes** and **Reflections** upon the precious book divine. The later reaching 62,000 in publication.

Sermon Starters

The Reality of Jesus *Colossians 1:16-23*

Introduction:

1. Until the reality of what Jesus has done for us, and what he has sacrificed dawned upon us, we will not function as real Christians should.
 - A. Only after we face the facts of what Jesus has done for each of us will we ever be pleasing to Him.
2. We are living in a time in which churches are producing a brand of religion which humanizes God, deifies man, and compromises sin.
 - A. Far too many pulpits are soft peddling the gospel as the church desperately dies from spiritual diabetes.
 - 1) Our spiritual diet consists of too much sugar!
 - B. This attitude has produced a generation of spiritual dwarfs who stand for nothing and fall for everything.
 - C. This anemic program has produced a wave of professing Christians, 95% of whom never win a soul to Christ.
3. The answer to the problem is a return to the right conception of what the cross of Christ really stands for.
 - A. Far too many of us basically have little or no understanding of what the cross really stands for.
 - 1) And we desperately need this understanding.
4. I want to suggest several things that will help us better understand the reality of Jesus.

Body:

1. His Position
 - A. No matter what man is teaching, believing, or doing today, Jesus is the head of the church, Col. 1:18.
 - 1) When we start understanding that Jesus is the head of the church, and not us, we will begin to appreciate what He has done for us.
 - B. Also, regardless of what man may believe, Jesus is the maker of the universe, Col. 1:16.
 - 1) The only "big bang" that ever came about was the bang momma heard when she dropped those who believe in evolution, or the so-called "big bang theory," on their heads when they were babies!
 - 2) When Moses wrote, "Let us make man in our image....," Jesus was there, Gen. 1:26.
 - 3) If we can comprehend the fact that when we disobey Jesus we are disobeying our Creator, we will do it less.
 - C. He is the image of the invisible God, Col. 1:15.
2. His Possessions
 - A. The universe is His, Col. 1:16.

- B. Christians are His by right of ownership through:
- 1) Creation, Gen. 1:26; Col. 1:16.
 - 2) Purchase, Acts 20:28.
- C. We need to understand that we are a possession of Christ's, and we will therefore serve Him.

3. His Power

- A. Matt. 28:18
- 1) Not some, not almost all, but ALL.
- B. As possessor of all power, He is King of kings, Lord of lords, Rev. 19:6
- C. As possessor of all power, He is the head of the church, Eph. 1:22,23; Col. 1:18.
- D. Surely a proper understanding of the power of the Lord will get us going, if anything will.

4. His Permanency

- A. The kingdom and the power of the Lord will never be destroyed.
- 1) It is permanent, Dan. 7:13-14.
 - A) No matter what one may say, the power that Jesus has is here to stay until He turns over the kingdom to God, 1 Cor. 15:24.

CONCLUSION:

1. The position, the possessions, the power, and the permanency of Christ ought to cause us to see His reality.
 - A. We cannot ignore the Christ of the cross.
 - B. We cannot destroy Him.
 - C. We cannot change His terms of discipleship.
 - 1) They must remain the same.
 - 2) If anything must change, it is us, Acts 3:19.
2. It is time for us to take up our cross (Lk. 9:23), and follow Jesus.
