*** Supporting information or detail will involve “arguments” in favor of your proposition. Additional information, such as supporting Scriptures will fall into this category. All illustrations will be found here also. (Keep in mind, illustrations illustrate, they do not prove.)

**** The Conclusion is just that, the conclusion. This time is used to “wrap up” your lesson. It is not the time to introduce new material or overlooked material. Once you say “And in conclusion”, conclude. Keep in mind – Stand up, Speak up, Shut Up, and Sit down.
